## About Lostness Indicators Report

Lostness Indicators report was created by the Missions Mobilization Team of the Kentucky Baptist Convention with information from the Glenmary Research Center. The data is compiled from the Religious Congregations \& Membership Study: 2020 and the U.S. Religion Census 2020.

## The latest study found that in the US:

Largest Denomination
The Catholic Church is the largest denomination in 1,231 counties (the U.S. has 3,143 counties).

## Most Churches

Southern Baptists have the most churches of any religious group: 51,379.

## Nondenominational

There are some 44,319 nondenominational churches, a jump of nearly 9,000 over 10 years ago, and about 9 million adherents.

## Non-Christian

Non-Christian bodies continue to increase their presence. The number of Muslims, for example, increased from 2.6 million to 4.5 million. The USRC includes congregation counts of five other non-Christian bodies, and congregation and adherent counts for Bahá'í, three Buddhist groups, three Hindu groups, and four Jewish groups.

Southern Baptists and United Methodists each lost more than one million members from 2010 to 2020.

The following pages contain information for all 120 Kentucky counties and is broken down by four categories: attendance ${ }^{*}$, membership, adherence, and population.

## Church Attendance: How Are We Doing?

There has been a significant decline in church attendance in the United States since the turn of the 21st century, according to multiple surveys of church attendance (Gallup and Pew Research). The trends show that the number of American's attending church once a week has declined by $12 \%$ (from $32 \%$ to 20\%) since 2000. If we lower the expectation, the number of people attending church once a month has declined by only $2 \%$ in the last 20 years, from $13 \%$ to $11 \%$. It's important to note that the number of Americans who never or seldom attend a religious service has increased by $7 \%$.

Meanwhile, the decline in church (synagogue, mosque or temple) attendance in the United States varies by demographics. Americans who are younger or older are more likely than those in the middle age groups to have experienced a drop in their church attendance. Black Americans are also more likely than others to see a sharp decline in church attendance.

While church attendance may be declining in America, Kentucky doesn't exactly mirror the trend according to Glenmary research (2020). Kentucky experienced an attendance increase, from an average of $13.9 \%$ in 2010 to $14.6 \%$ in 2020 and a $2.5 \%$ increase over 2000 average attendance of $12.1 \%$.

However, these percentage statistics are not necessarily cause for celebration because the number of people attending Kentucky churches has decreased and here's why. Kentucky's population was 4,339,367 in 2010. Since average attendance was $13.9 \%$, that means $3,730,195$ ( $86.1 \%$ ) people were not in church on any-given Sunday. Kentucky's population increased to $4,505,836$ in 2020 and average attendance was $14.6 \%$. While there may have been a percentage increase in average attendance, because of the population increase the number of people not attending a church on any-given Sunday was $3,847,984$ (85.4\%).
That's an increase of 117,789 non-attenders!
Church leaders should look at these statistics with hope, motivation, and some concern. We have the responsibility and opportunity to connect people in our community with Jesus Christ through the local church. Now is the time to increase our commitment to evangelism, missions, and discipleship while opening our doors to the least of these. What steps will your church take to increase attendance that results in baptizing believers, making disciples and sending members on mission?

## What Does Church Membership Look Like?

According to recent research (Gallup 2021), there has been a continued decline in church membership. The number of American's who say they belong to a church, synagogue or mosque is down $23 \%$ from what it was in 1999.

The two main things driving the drop in church membership is more adults with no religious preference and falling rates of church membership among those who do claim religious adherence. These trends are obvious in each of the generations over time.

Overall, while church membership is declining in America, the rate of decline in Kentucky isn't quite as steep according to the most recent Glenmary research (2020). How will Kentucky Baptist churches respond to these changing times?
