They were trapped in 55-

degree water. Hypothermia was a threat. The miners stayed warm by adopting the following plan: When one would get cold, the other eight would huddle around the person and warm that person, and when another person got cold, another miner returned the favor.

Each miner had strong moments and discouraging moments. The other eight would rally around that 1 when a miner became weak or discouraged. They worked as a team.

As I read this story, I thought about how important it is to pull together as ministers and as churches. Ministry can be lonely at times. A pastor or staff minister can get discouraged during those frigid ministry moments. Paul reminds us, "Now we who are strong ought to bear the weaknesses of those without strength and not just please ourselves." (Romans 15:1, NASB 1995)



Pray and ask God to guide you to that minister or

church who needs you. Perhaps a sister church could benefit from your church's assistance and prayers.





